

## Requirements for providing behavioral health services to BCN members

For BCN HMO<sup>SM</sup> and BCN Advantage<sup>SM</sup>

Published Oct. 15, 2014 / Effective Jan. 1, 2015 / Updated January 2020

The supervision requirements below are for billing purposes only.

First, find the correct practice setting, below – either a solo/group practice or a substance abuse/outpatient psychiatric clinic.

Then, locate the practitioner type and identify the requirements for that practitioner.

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- (1) Claims must be submitted with the treating provider's modifier.
- (2) PGY-3 and PGY-4 residents are third- and fourth-year psychiatry residents, respectively.
- (3) For dates of service prior to June 1, 2018, LLPs and LMFTs can treat BCN members only under an LP supervisor.
- (4) For dates of service prior to Feb. 1, 2018, PAs can treat BCN members only under an MD/DO supervisor.
- (5) All supervising providers must be individually enrolled and credentialed <u>and</u> claims must be submitted with the treating provider's modifier.
- (6) Effective Jan. 7, 2020, behavior analysts must be licensed by the state of Michigan to be reimbursed by BCN.
- (7) Effective Jan. 1, 2020, clinical nurse specialists (also referred to as clinical nurse specialists-certified) who are certified in gerontology, adult gerontology or adult psychiatric mental health are eligible for reimbursement by BCN. If the CNS is in a behavioral health group practice, the group must be contracted and must include a physician for clinical supervision. If the CNS is in an OPC/substance use disorders facility, the facility must be contracted and must include a physician for clinical supervision. CNSs can provide assessment, medication management, group therapy and family therapy services. Refer to the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs website for additional information.
